AGM Business

Presentation and Special Resolution

We had a very good turn-up for the AGM on 17 October 2013. This was probably because of the interest in the presentation by Bill Ramsay, President of Birdlife Melbourne, his theme being "Birds in Backyards". There is a full report of Bill's talk elsewhere in the Newsletter.

The other business of the AGM was dealt with as normal except for a Special Resolution about our Rules of Association. As a result of the new Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic) the committee had determined that the Association should adopt a revised set of Rules of Association. All financial members of the Friends of Scotchmans Creek and Valley Reserve Inc. were sent a copy of the proposed revised Rules of Association.

A vote was called for on the motion "That the members of the Friends of Scotchmans Creek and Valley Reserve Inc. adopt the revised Rules of Association which are contained in the document 'Friends of Scotchmans Creek and Valley Reserve Inc. - Rules of Association – October 2013 (Proposed)". The motion was carried unanimously.

The new rules are practically the same as the old ones with minor changes in line with the requirements of the new Act. The most significant change is probably the one to allow communications and voting by electronic means.

- The Scotchmans Creek corridor is only in Fair condition
- Litter is persistent. A lot of litter escapes the trap at Blackburn Road, to be trapped in the wetlands vegetation. We need bet-

ter litter control at the source

- Sandy sediment (eroded from crushed granite pathways) inhibits in-stream vegetation and clogs stream-bed habitat, especially near the join of the Fiander and Crosby arms east of Blackburn Road
- The wetlands inlet regulator remains blocked by sandy sediment, preventing treatment of low flows. Melbourne Water advise that redesign is more difficult than expected
- Occasional greasy/fatty contamination occurs in the Glen Waverley Drain.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer reported that total assets were \$4,969.17 consisting of cash in the bank, credit union shares and petty cash. There were liabilities of \$941.43 being grant funds committed to certain projects. Income for the year was \$15,461.28 consisting of fund raising receipts of \$22.86, grant funds of \$14,740.00, interest of \$388.82,

reimbursement of \$39.60 and subscriptions/donations of \$270.00. Expenses totalled \$14,795.10, being \$14,740.00 grant costs, bank charges of \$7.50 and \$47.60 office costs. The equity was \$4,027.74.

October

The conductivity rating at the Fiander Arm (site YSC010) was Degraded. There have been several similar outstanding results at this site recently.

Phosphorus results are Fair/Poor, which is typical of all sites in past measurements.

There continues to be very little instream or overhanging vegetation at either site 2 (Regent Street) or site 3 (Valley Creek), resulting in small invertebrate samples and Poor ratings.

November

Overnight rain caused higher water levels and flows than usual, and had been sufficient to flow through the wetlands ponds (despite the clogged inlet pit).

The water quality was generally Good or Excellent, as expected with the good flow, except for Poor and Fair phosphate results at the two sites where we measured it, and Poor turbidity results in the wetlands ponds.

We obtained only small numbers of invertebrates, mostly varieties tolerant or very tolerant of poor water quality, with the exception of one caddisfly larva (very sensitive to water quality). Consequently the water quality ratings were poor. However the unusually high water levels and flows may have caused many invertebrates to move to sheltered locations and so escape our sampling.

Birds in Backyards

Bill Ramsay has been gazing at birds through his binoculars for 40 years or so, making numerous trips to coastal and inland Australia as well as offshore territories, adding species to his bird list. His passion has taken him to places such as Thursday Island, Lord Howe Island, Norfolk Island, Macquarie Island, Christmas Island, Cocos (Keeling) Islands and Ashmore Reef.

He gave us the benefit of this experience during his presentation at our Annual General Meeting in October.

Bill structured his talk by explaining first the things you need in your garden to attract a range of birds. The basics are water, somewhere to perch, shelter for small birds, good nest sites and plenty of food.

He went on to explain the key points in identifying birds, because it's much more satisfying if you know what birds are actually paying you a visit. You need to look carefully at size, shape, plumage, bill and legs and then listen out for the call.

You'll also need your binoculars and a field guide. In these digital days there is even an 'app' for your electronic device which will play the bird call for you!

Bill then discussed birds grouped by the food they eat, although most birds have a varied diet so there is considerable overlap. He illustrated this with glorious photos of the food groups and the birds in each group (modestly acknowledging that the images were provided by BirdLife Melbourne Members including Janet Hand, Sonja Ross and himself).

He concluded by giving us some information about BirdLife Melbourne. Anyone with an interest in joining this organisation can get all the details at www.birdlife.org.au and then going to Birdlife Melbourne.

This was a presentation full of interest and we are grateful to Bill for taking the time and effort to come to our meeting. Look out for our "Speaker's Forum" program next year so you don't miss coming to one of these great presentations.
