Summer in Valley Reserve

We are coming into the hard time of the year, you could be forgiven for thinking that we are already there, when there are fewer flowers and more windy weather resulting in stressed trees losing branches. After many months with a steady but moderate amount of rain we have experienced hotter drier weather and more recently some much needed rain.

There are still flowers to be seen. The Hop Goodenia with its yellow flowers is on display. The Bulbine Lilies are beginning to show more seeds than yellow flowers on their tall stalks. The yellow and orange flowers of the Grey Parrot-peas are adding to the display. The mauve flowers of the

Kangaroo Apple are beginning to be seen. The Clematis seed heads are opening out into fluffy balls. The Flax Lilies are now showing their delicate mauve flowers. The spiny bursaria are in flower and attracting the bees and other insects with their sweet smelling white flowers.

Grants from Melbourne Water

Each year in October your committee applies for grants from Melbourne Water to fund our planting program for the following year.

We are delighted to report that we have been successful again with our request for project grants to enable us to purchase plants for our planting program:

- 1. \$3,300 for Regent Street Reserve 2 000 plants
- 2. \$13,200 for National Tree Day at Fairway Reserve 8 000 plants
- 3. \$3,300 for Crosby Drive Reserve 2 000 plants

Clean Up Australia Day on Sunday 1st March

This year's theme is Step Up to Clean Up. See the attached poster for the details.

Bring your children and grand-children along and help us tidy up the Scotchmans Creek corridor by removing the litter that accumulates during the year.

Each year the mix of different types of litter is slightly different but the ever present plastic drink bottle is still a problem. Comments

On this occasion one third of the phys/chem ratings were Poor or Degraded, and the waterbug ratings were Poor.

- Upstream, Scotchmans Ck (Site 1a, Fiander arm) had Degraded conductivity and ammonium. The ammonium sample measured 0.5 ppm, which is the limit of the test kit's range, but confirmed by remeasurement with a diluted sample.
- Also upstream, the Glen Waverley drain (site 1b, Crosby arm) was alright.
- Dowstream, Scotchmans Ck (Site 2, Regent St) was flowing more strongly than upstream, presumably still draining the wetlands after the locally moderate mid week rain event. Oxygen was low (Degraded), turbidity and phosphorus were Poor, but ammonium was Good.
 - The waterbugs found here included many more mosquito larvae than usual.
- Valley Ck (Site 3) was trickling. Oxygen was very low (Degraded) and turbidity was Poor.
 - About 20 tadpoles were found in the waterbug sample, but the invertebrates were mostly Tolerant and Very Tolerant varieties.
